Aim

• To offer undergraduate students at University of Cambridge and other local universities an exciting opportunity to conduct a summer research project in a lab within the Cambridge Infectious Diseases (CID) network. This project will be supported by a competitively awarded grant to the student.




- Any undergraduate student at the
 - University of Cambridge, Anglia Ruskin University or University of East Anglia,
 - in their second year of study, or third year if their course is 4 years or longer, is eligible to submit an application.
- We encourage undergraduates from a broad range of subjects to apply who are keen to expand their knowledge in the field of infectious diseases.

Student application process

- Applicants are requested to submit a **cover letter** and their CV by e-mail to the CID manager Maria Bargues-Ribera (mb2464@cam.ac.uk).
- In the cover letter, applicants must specify which project proposal they would like to pursue and whether the supervisor/co-supervisor has confirmed suitability.
- Application deadline is Friday 19th April.

What is available?




There will be a list of projects from across the CID interdisciplinary network of experts dispersed in different departments of the University.

Project proposal submission

- Junior and senior researchers within CID can submit project proposals suitable to complete within the 8-weeks period of time.
- Project proposals should be around 200-250 words, and indicate supervisor/co-supervisors and any essential knowledge or skills that would be advantageous for the student.
- We will display the list of project proposals on the CID website and reach out to student cohorts within the eligible
- Students will be asked to contact the supervisors of their projects of interest prior to application.
- Application deadline is Sunday 24th March.

What is expected of the successful candidate?

- The student will join a CID lab during the 8-weeks period
- The student will be required to **submit a short report** at the end of the project summarising their experience.
